

#### **Message from the Assistant Chief**

The women and men of your police department have kept very busy during this past quarter. The severe weather conditions and flooding we experienced posed a grave danger to our citizens and brought the significant loss of public and private property. In little less than one hour, nine intersections were blocked by flood water throughout the cove district. Effectively isolating our neighborhoods with flooding, the rain quickly made key driving routes impassable. I reflect proudly upon our citizens and the individual efforts they made to help our police officers and city workers as we collectively faced down this natural disaster. I am appreciative for the courtesy and understanding our officers received from motorists as they patiently navigated around the affected areas.

The crime trends from July, August, and September indicate significant reductions for incidents of theft, burglary, aggravated assaults, and vehicle thefts. I continue to monitor the incidents of robbery, as that metric has taken a sharp increase over the same period in 2013. Looking at some of the many factors which contribute to crimes, I have asked the Special Enforcement Team and Investigations Bureau about recent robberies. I've learned, while an increase number of robberies has occurred, we are not experiencing a string of connected crimes. Furthermore, the aggressive deployment and investigative stride of our special units quickly closes the majority of cases with apprehension. In short, La Quinta doesn't maintain a back log of "cold cases."

I want to continue the involvement of our citizens for the areas of crime prevention. I feel an important strategy will always be a combination of aggressive police deployment to combat emergent issues and citizen awareness. The La Quinta Police will continue spending their time reaching outward as we look for ways to create a formidable presence against criminals. My office will continue offering citizen training seminars in crime prevention and environmental designs aimed at reducing attractiveness to criminals.

#### Significant Activity for July-September 2014

On July 3 at 11:00 AM, the La Quinta Special Enforcement Team Officers served a property related search warrant at 44 Durango Circle in Rancho Mirage and recovered stolen property from a theft investigation that had occurred in February 2014 at 47530 Via Montego in La Quinta. At 3:00 PM, SET Officers served a second property related search warrant at 13875 Kay Street in Desert Hot Springs, and recovered additional stolen property. The crime occurred when the suspect, Katherine Richards (67 yrs of Rancho Mirage), defrauded the victim for more than \$10,000 in property. The search warrants yielded the majority of the property that was defrauded. The search warrant was authored by Officer Evan Kibbey. Criminal charges were filed for Richards, who is currently in living in Canada.

On August 8 at 11:00 AM, the La Quinta Special Enforcement Team Officers served a property related search warrant at 52415 Avenida Herrera. The warrant stemmed from several commercial burglaries at the La Quinta Ralphs where a suspect cashed fictitious recycle vouchers. SET Officer McAnallen identified Frederick Hanson (44 yrs of La Quinta), as the suspect. During the service of the search warrant, additional fictitious vouchers were located in Hanson's room. In addition to the vouchers, methamphetamine and drug paraphernalia were located. Ashley Williams, 25 years old from La Quinta, was arrested for possession of meth and paraphernalia and booked into the Indio Jail. Officer Chris McAnallen authored the search warrant. On August 22 12:00 PM, SET Officer Chris McAnallen conducted a follow-up investigation on the crime. He interviewed Frederick Hanson (48 yrs of La Quinta) at the Indio Jail. Based on the interview, Hanson was arrested for burglary, forgery, possession of personal information, and felon in possession of ammunition. This is a separate criminal case then what Hanson is currently being held on.

On September 9 at 4:00 PM, La Quinta Special Enforcement Team Officers conducted a follow-up investigation and surveillance operation on a suspect of an attempt murder incident from 081014 at 52295 Avenida Alvarado. The suspect, Tyler Allen Diaz, 23 yrs of La Quinta, assaulted the victim by shooting two arrows from a compound cross-bow. SET Officers located Diaz in the area of Calle Vallejo and Avenida Herrera. SET Deputy Cameron James completed a search warrant and interviewed Diaz. Diaz was booked into the Indio Jail for attempt murder.

#### **Significant Activity for July-September 2014**

In July, August and September, La Quinta BDU participated in the Coffee with a Cop event at Panera Bread, Broken Yolk and Louise's Pantry in La Quinta. Officers were engaged in various topics of discussion with numerous residents over the course of the events. These Coffee with a Cop events allowed the public to meet with law enforcement personnel in a relaxed environment and talk about a wide range of issues.

In July, La Quinta BDU Officers served a search warrant on the 79100 block of Avenue 42 in the unincorporated area of Bermuda Dunes. The search warrant was related to a recent theft incident at the La Quinta Wal-Mart. Upon the service of the search warrant, Officers located small amounts of heroin and methamphetamine. Two suspects were arrested and for theft, fraudulent use of credit cards, possession of heroin, possession of methamphetamine, possession of drug paraphernalia, violation of felony probation, and committing a felony while on bail. Additionally, Riverside County Child Protective Services (CPS) was contacted and took custody of the two small children.

In August, La Quinta BDU Officers conducted a follow-up investigation regarding a robbery that occurred on July 25 outside of the La Quinta on the 79000 block of Highway 111 in the city of La Quinta. BDU Officers contacted the 43 years old suspect from Indio, at his business located on the 77000 block of Wildcat Drive in Palm Desert. The suspect was arrested and later booked into the Indio Jail for the robbery. BDU Officers later authored and served a robbery related search warrant for the suspect's residence on the 45000 block of Pelican Hill in the city of Indio.

In August, La Quinta BDU conducted a follow-up investigation regarding a credit card fraud at the Chevrolet Cadillac Dealership of La Quinta. The suspect used the victim's information to place an order for parts at the La Quinta Chevrolet dealership on August 27th, and was to retrieve them the next day. BDU identified the possible suspect and ultimately contacted the 38-year old male suspect in front of his residence on the 82000 block of Lordsburg Drive, Indio. He was arrested for the fraud, and a probation compliance check was completed at his residence. The suspect obtained the victim's credit card information while working as the owner of B&E Appliance Heating and Air Conditioning business in Indio. He was booked into the Indio Jail for identity theft and credit card fraud. Two weeks later, La Quinta BDU authored and served a property related search warrant on the 82000 block of Lordsburg Drive in the city of Indio. Again, the 38 year old suspect from Indio was arrested for a second identity theft and credit card fraud. In addition to the credit card fraud, the suspect was found to be operating his business under a state contractor's license number that does not belong to him. He was booked into the Indio Jail for the Indio

In September, La Quinta BDU developed a Robbery and Burglary Suppression Program in the business district of La Quinta. During the program officers patrolled the area in marked and unmarked patrol units in effort to apprehend and/or deter crime in the city. The program was in response to an increase in commercial burglaries and robberies during the late night and early morning hours.

The above mentioned incidents are just a sample of the quarterly activity conducted by the La Quinta Business District Unit. Officers from BDU have conducted several investigations related to the La Quinta Highway 111 Business Corridor which have resulted in numerous arrests for thefts and frauds. La Quinta BDU will continue their pro-active and community oriented policing efforts throughout the city which will result in increased awareness and education within the business community in order to improve the quality of life for the business owners, shoppers, and residents of La Quinta.



In July, the Traffic Services Team conducted holiday weekend DUI saturation enforcement to educate and enforce DUI laws in the city of La Quinta.


In July, the Traffic Services Team participated in motorcycle training in partnership with the Palm Desert Police Station to increase motorcycle riding skills, tactics and safety.





In July, SRO Klicka investigated a report of two subjects "smoking and injecting themselves with drugs" SRO Klicka Arrested Kenneth Takata and Derek McGowan for Possession of a Controlled Substance, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and Possession of a Controlled Substance for Sales.

In July, SRO Klicka Coordinated and ran the 9th Annual La Quinta Police Cadet Academy from July 21 to August 15. The Cadet Academy consisted of approximately 50 Middle School Aged Students and introduced them to the various facets of Public Service. #### La Quinta High School

In July & August, SRO Contreras assisted with the La Quinta Police Cadet Academy.

In August and September, SRO Contreras provided security for four Friday varsity football games.

In September, SRO Contreras contacted a student who was trying to leave school during class. SRO Contreras was able to determine the student had marijuana in his vehicle which was parked across the street at the La Quinta Park. SRO Contreras conducted a search of the vehicle and located the marijuana and over 1100 rounds of ammunition. The student told SRO Contreras the vehicle is shared with his father who went shooting over the weekend. SRO Contreras initiated Riverside County's Kids With Guns Protocol and went to the student's residence to search for evidence of suspicious activity and weapons. SRO Contreras spoke with the student's father who advised he did go shooting over the weekend and forgot to take the ammunition out of the vehicle prior to his son taking it to school. SRO Contreras determined the student and father were not a threat to the safety of the school. SRO Contreras filed charges against the student for possession of marijuana and being a minor in possession of a smoking device.

In September, SRO Contreras along with SRO Klicka took aerial photos of all schools within La Quinta city limits to include in Rapid Response Planning. SRO's Contreras and Klicka also took aerial photos of La Quinta City Hall and La Quinta Park to include in Rapid Response Planning.

In September, La Quinta SRO's were part of a resource fair put on by the Riverside County Probation Department. The resource fair consisted of multiple organizations for parents and students to go and inquire on various services for their youth.
