Thunderstorm Coverage Increases | High Impact Flooding Likely SE California/SW Arizona

KEY POINTS

- · Major to Extreme Risk heavy flooding rainfall in SW Arizona & SE California today through early Monday
- Widespread rainfall totals of 2-4" probable in SE California with isolated accumulations up to 8 inches possible resulting in significant and possibly locally catastrophic impacts
- Much lower amounts closer to around 0.25-0.50" across south-central Arizona through this weekend.

Wind Advisory issued for southeast California and southwest Arizona Sunday afternoon and evening.








Flood Watch Map.png




PSR Excessive Rainfall Outlook
